On Friday 28th October the children are invited to come to school in fancy dress as part of our Halloween celebrations (no scary masks as these frighten the younger children). We will have a catwalk show in the morning with the opportunity for everyone to walk the runway and admire the wonderful costumes on display. This is one of our annual charity fundraisers with the monies raised this year going to the Sands NI charity. LATE CLASS

Late Class is an after school service that enables P1 and 2 children to remain in school for an additional hour and travel home with older siblings or be collected at 2:40pm. The children engage in supervised play inside and out during this time. If you would like your child to avail of this service places can be booked on the School Money app.

BE BRIGHT, BE SEEN!

With the darker mornings and evenings closing in the children are encouraged to wear high visibility vests or reflectors when travelling between home, bus stops and school to help motorists see them more clearly.

SAFEGUARDING TEAM

PARENT TEACHER MEETINGS

Parent teacher meetings will take place in school, week beginning 14th November for P1 – P6 children. Appointment times shall be sent out prior to this. P7 meetings are scheduled for the 17th-20th October and appointments have already been issued to parents.

IEPS

If your child has an Individual Education Plan the class teacher will discuss these with you. Please ensure all documents are signed and returned to school as soon as possible.

BUS PASSES

If your child/children are eligible for a bus pass, please apply for one.

The statutory qualifying distance for primary school children is 2 miles between home and school and there must be no similar schools within closer distance to your home address. Further information can be found on the EA website www.eani.org.uk

HEALTHY BREAK

We are a healthy eating school and encourage the children to make healthy choices. Please ensure your child has a healthy snack with him/her to eat at breaktime. Children receiving a school dinner will also need a healthy break.

WATER

The children are encouraged to bring a flask/bottle of water to school everyday to help keep keep them hydrated and ready to learn.

POST PRIMARY TRANSFER

The GL Assessment will take place on 12th November for Primary Seven children that are registered to sit the Entrance Assessment.

FLU VACCINATION

The school nursing team will be in on Friday 7th October to deliver the flu vaccine to the children with parental consent granted. Consent forms were issued a few weeks back and should have been returned to school whether or not consent is given. Any outstanding forms should be sent in on the morning of the 7th October.

DOGS

Parents are reminded that in the interest of pupil safety, dogs should not be on school grounds. This includes drop off/collection times.

SHARED EDUCATION

We are in our sixth year of Shared Education with our friends in Groggan Primary School. The funding for the CASE Shared Education project is due to end in March. We are very grateful for the opportunities, experiences and resources the programme has afforded us over the years. This year our focus throughout the school will be on animation as part of UICT as well as Literacy and Numeracy development. The children will have opportunities to come together and share outings/school trips.

PUPIL WELLBEING

The teaching staff have completed training in the Solihull approach and we will be continuing to use the Neuronimo programme with each class this year again.
